Here's an **update on the dam construction**: The contractor has completed clearing and grubbing operations, and is preparing to install the waterline on the north side of North Berkeley Lake Road. The

pump system has been installed and is working to draw the lake down to elevation 912. As of yesterday, the water level was at 938.34, and is coming down approximately 1.5 feet per day. Once the lake is down to about elevation 912, the contractor will remove the fish. They will begin excavating the downstream toe of the dam along North Berkeley Lake Road to elevation 908, and will install a dewatering system to draw down the water table. You can get an overall view from this aerial photo taken on April 3.

No TV's will be accepted at City Hall. If you need to dispose of a TV please call Advanced Disposal and they will pick up at your home. Iron Mountain will provide paper shredding and Roy Crawford will take scrap metal, appliances, lawn mowers, grills, car and truck batteries, etc. ReBoot will take your computer and information technology equipment, cabling and other electronics. They also provide donation forms for tax deduction. There is a \$5.00 charge for each CRT monitor. They do NOT take microwaves, just IT equipment. Please remember that this is a service of your city provided only to you as citizens. You will need to bring identification showing a Berkeley Lake address.

Some of you have asked if the city has organized a garage sale, but we only do that once a year, and not this time.
