Remember that our <u>Fall Earth Day</u> will be this **Saturday**, **October 13 from 9:00 AM until 1:00 PM at City Hall**. Please remember to bring proof of city residency since this service is not for others beyond our city. Advanced Disposal will be there to take yard waste, large household items such as desks, mattresses, box springs, etc. but they will not be taking construction debris, carpet, wet paints, entire trees or televisions. You can contact Advanced Disposal to arrange for televisions to be picked up individually. Iron Mountain will be providing secure paper shredding services. The Friends of Disabled Adults and Children will be here to take a variety of home medical equipment (wheelchairs, walkers, shower and toilet supports, therapy aides, canes, specialized mattresses, etc.) They also need gently used household items for their thrift store, so clean out the attic! You can bring electronic and computer items as well as scrap metal, appliances, lawn mowers, grills, and car/truck batteries.

There will also be a <u>City-Wide Garage Sale</u> on Friday and Saturday, October 12 and 13 from 8:00 AM - 2:00 PM with advertising in the newspaper and on Craig's List provided by the city.

It's going to be a busy weekend around here because there will also be a big **ArtFest in our city** from 10:00 AM to 7:00 PM Saturday and noon to 6:00 PM Sunday. You may have been confused by signs appearing like this.

What has happened is that after much work to prepare for a Peachtree Corners art festival, the organizer (one of their new city council members) found that it would not be allowed where they had planned it. He contacted me to ask for help and we found a place for him on Peachtree Industrial Boulevard. Your council and staff have held an extra meeting and worked hard to make arrangements that would be good for the festival organizers



as well as Berkeley Lake. Our goal is to become good neighbors with this new city. Come out and enjoy food, art, and lots of other vendors plus a Kidz Zone with face painting, balloons, slides, bull ride and much more. A beer/wine garden will be presented by our Berkeley Lake restaurant GABBA. Sheriff's deputies will be providing security. Some of the funds raised at this event will be given in grants to community organizations, and we have been promised some decision making participation in awarding those. Our contractors continue to work hard on the **dam** in spite of some difficulties. As you will recall I was hoping to get permission from Safe Dams to begin refilling the lake at least in the deep part before the actual final finish of the dam, perhaps as early as November. To that end, we had Tom Woosley of Safe Dams out to visit recently, but did not get a good answer to this question. Our plans have always been to build some extensive testing mechanisms into this new dam that will remain within it for future ongoing safety monitoring. Tom is, understandably I guess, reluctant to release us to accumulate any significant amount of water until all of

those monitoring devices are completely installed, and that won't be done in November. We are going to invite him back in another couple of weeks and discuss it further, but early refilling is not looking good. We are struggling to keep on schedule to finish up in January, now bringing in tested and approved fill material and continuing to build blanket and chimney drains.

I have received notice from the state that our city's **Stormwater Annual Report** has been reviewed and is acceptable. What this means to you is that the city can continue to deal effectively with stormwater infrastructure while shielding you from the county's Stormwater Utility Fees, and without charging you a separate fee like Duluth, Norcross, and many other cities do.
