Because we are expecting so many people and we have so many attractions coming, there will not be space for much parking at the Chapel. This year we will have a van shuttling people between the school and the Chapel. It will be marked with the Berkeley Lake Ordinance Enforcement signs on the doors. Please park at Berkeley Lake Elementary School and let us whisk you to the festivities. The shuttle should be moving quickly between both ends of its very short route so there will be little if any waiting for you. You can park in either their upper or lower lots and the van will meet you in front of the school's main entrance.
