We haven't had any unusual **coyote** activity, but we all know they're an ongoing presence in suburban neighborhoods now,

so I'm sharing some info here that I found on <u>www.urbancoyoteproject.com</u>. They have some helpful suggestions about what to do if you run into one while walking your dog. I do that daily and have never seen a coyote, but that doesn't mean I won't; so I think it's helpful to be prepared. They suggest that you keep your dog on a 6 foot leash. This length is long enough to let your dog have some freedom but not so long that you can't easily control your dog should you need to, especially at a moment's notice. Be especially alert if walking your dog at sunrise and sunset hours and stay out of overgrown brushy areas. If you come across a coyote, stand tall in an assertive posture. They are wary of humans and your presence is usually enough to drive off a coyote. Maintain eye contact and yell at him. Do not turn your back on the coyote and do not run. Running away can trigger a coyote's prey drive and may cause him or her to chase you. Avoid leaving your pet outside alone, especially at night, and don't keep pet food outside.

She and other outstanding leaders in our state will benefit from training and working together for the good of us all. Besides being our Berkeley Lake Mayor Pro Tempore, Rebecca is president of the Georgia Piedmont Land Trust and serves on the Executive Board of the Gwinnett Municipal Association. The Gwinnett County Office of Emergency Management is offering **free Community Emergency Response Team training**. It starts Tuesday, September 8. Participants will be trained in basic disaster response skills such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. Courses are open to all Gwinnett County residents 18 years and older who pass a background check provided by the Gwinnett County Police Department. The training consists of eight sessions that take place from 6:30 PM to 9:00 PM on Tuesdays. A course review and disaster simulation will take place on Saturday, October 24 from 8:00 AM to noon. Sign up soon; class size is limited to 25 participants, and it would be great to have some folks with this training in our neighborhoods.
