Since giving our contractor notice to proceed on February 2nd, the following progress has been made on **dam repair**. The contractor cut a notch in the dam and installed two new siphons for lowering the lake. As of February 29th, the lake elevation had been pulled down to elevation 951 (the normal pool elevation is 974.6). When It gets to elevation 940, we plan to install a pump system to continue draining the lake. The target elevation is 912. That will leave about four feet of water in the lake to accommodate the pump system. The contractor has submitted a pump design for approval. He has submitted and we and Gwinnett County DOT have approved a Traffic Control/Detour Plan. North Berkeley Lake Road will be closed to through traffic from March **19, 2012 to February 2013.** That will certainly change things around here! You can expect to see erosion control BMPs (Best Management Practices) erected and clearing and grubbing of trees in mid March. The fish removal plan is for the contractor to electrically stun the fish, put them in oxygenated live haul tanks and take them to a storage facility in Ball Ground, Georgia. Any remaining fish not captured by the electro-fishing technique will be captured with a seine net and removed. Remember that, like all construction sites everywhere, this one is off limits to the public for their own safety. I've talked with the contractor about developing a designated and safe observation spot since so many of us are interested in seeing what's going on, but until we work that out, please keep yourselves and your kids at a safe distance.

I am so proud of all that our **Berkeley Lake Conservancy** has been doing. They've recently worked very hard to remove a lot of invasive plants from our Greenspace area. Check out the before and after <u>pictures in an article on our website</u>. You'll be amazed. My thanks to our BLC committee members and the additional volunteers they recruited for this project including Kevin Osburn, Chris Kimberley, Cary and Marty Thornton, Donna and Jim Gawlas, and Sharman Sykes. The Berkeley Lake Conservancy will be hosting a Wildflower Walk on Sunday, March 25th at 3:00PM through the Greenspace, hoping to see Piedmont azaleas and other spring ephemerals blooming. After the walk, Susan Hanson, our activist Conservancy chairperson, has invited us to her home. Seeing Susan's garden will be a treat and on top of that she's making Mexican casserole for us. That agreement is to govern the next 7 years in **Service Delivery Strategy** issues between the county and city.
