It has your date of birth and other info on it that is personal which the Federal Trade Commission says could be used for identity theft. Laminating may smear the ink, and you may need to add a booster to the card later.

In my last Mayor's Message, I mentioned that I was hoping for an **electronics** recycling event in our city, and also shared info on an upcoming one done by Gwinnett County. I hope if you needed that you made it to the county one, because the business which usually does our local electronics recycling has been bought by another company and won't be doing this event right now as they transition.
