

I want you to know about two things that I will be discussing with Council soon so that you can share any input you may have with council members or me. We will very soon be setting the millage rate for next year and I will be recommending a drop in that rate from 1.746 to 1.455. Our property values are increasing so that for this year I believe we can drop the rate and still be able to collect enough taxes if we continue with our very careful fiscal management. There is some concern on the part of some on the Citizen Finance Committee about doing this, since most if not all other cities have raised theirs last year and costs are really going up a lot now, as you know from managing your own budgets. However, I think we'll be ok for this year. Council will consider everything carefully as they always do and decide. Secondly, we will be digging into our contract with Waste Management. There were some complaints a while back, but we haven't heard much recently since they moved to respond to our concerns. Also, some exploration of other companies has made our situation look pretty good by comparison. However, if any of you still have any concerns or opinions about this, now's the time to let us know.



This is the time of year when mama deer will often hide **fawns near your home** for the day while they forage, hoping that near humans they will be safer from predators. Please don't assume a fawn is an orphan, because unless they are crying, running around looking for mom or showing signs of dehydration (curled ears) or hunger, they should be left alone. We are advised to contact a wildlife rehabilitator before moving a fawn.

Susan Hanson and our dedicated Berkeley Lake Conservancy members always encourage us, as you know, to **stick with native plants** in our landscaping. The City had a special seminar with a visiting speaker not long ago about that and we are all pretty convinced, but it's hard to know what plants to use instead of some very common non-natives that we see everywhere. Here's the <u>best thing I have found to help with that, and this website is Susan–approved</u>. It's great to have someone like Susan, a Master Gardener that we know and trust, to help us with good advice.



Many of you already know and appreciate the **Southwest Gwinnett Chamber of Commerce** which supports businesses in Norcross, Peachtree Corners, and Berkeley Lake.
