1. PZV 19-02, 266 Lakeshore Drive, Applicant/Owner Jeff Glynn, requests relief from Section 78-197 (6) of the Zoning Ordinance to reduce the building setback from the shoreline of Lake Berkeley in the R-100 District from 40 feet to 25 feet to expand a non-conforming structure.
